Note that after the immigration date in the first column, the 2-4 columns line up the great grandparents (1 G), 2G great-great grandparents and the 3G grandparents.

The last 3 columns are the way stations on their immigration journey- stops one, two and three in America.

1-G= Great-Grandparents Halvor Holtan & Gunhild Thorvilson, Fred & Annie Onstad Suby, and Amund & Elsie Dahlby were all just barely born in America. Bendick Tweeten and Olava Hovland were the only ones of that

1-G generation born in Norway, partly because they both immigrated later, and Olava was only a toddler of 2 years.

Of 8 pairs of the next older 2-G generation, only Bendick's parents did not immigrate. I originally said Jorgen & Sigrid Nordgarden were probably the highest status of our 2-G grandparents and people with means did not often immigrate. But since then I learned that Sigrid married beneath her station, just as Margit did, Jorgen disappeared, and she may even have come to America with her small children, but there is no record of her arriving here. Remember the 3-G grandparents for Bendick's and Margit's (Hans Holtan) lines are the same, Tarjei and Else Mandt Nordgarden.

Of our 16 pairs of 3-G grandparents, only 5 couples and 2 widowed parents came to America, Hans Holtan's parents, Aaste Haavrud Dahlby's, Gulbrand Hovland's, both sets of Leif and Martha Suby's parents, and two of Annie Onstad's widowed grandparents.

They were probably the poorest of the families in Norway and needed the support of their children.

The earliest families who arrived (1840's and 50's) came to Wisconsin and some few stayed there.

The next wave came in the 1860's when the frontier had moved west so they came first to SE Minnesota.

Next of the immigrants, in 1873, Bendick Tweeten, 2 generations and 30 years later than the first, came directly to Iowa.

The last of the immigrants, in 1883, Ole and Joren Hovland, came to Iowa and then went west to the Red River Valley, Rothsay, MN.

5 couples came as newly married young couples.

Only 3 couples of the 18 couples married in America- Leif and Martha Suby, Peter and Aaste Dahlby and Bendick and Olava Tweeten.

These 3 men came as singles, the women with their families. Peder Dahlby's family had already come and he came later.

7 couples or widowed parents came as older immigrants with or after their families came.
